## Tax

Australian residents pay no tax on the first $\$ 18,200$ they earn in income (correct as of Sep 2023). This is called the tax-free threshold and equates to earning:

- \$361 a week
- \$722 a fortnight


## You should claim the tax-free threshold on your highest paying job.

Person 1 works two three-hour shifts at business 1 and earns $\$ 25$ an hour. They also work one eight-hour shift at another business and are paid $\$ 22$ an hour. With which business should they claim the tax-free threshold?

The amount of tax you pay depends on the amount of income you earn. The tax brackets for the 2023-2024 financial year are:

| Taxable income | Tax on this income |
| :--- | :--- |
| $0-\$ 18,200$ | Nil |
| $\$ 18,201-\$ 45,000$ | $19 c$ for each $\$ 1$ over $\$ 18,200$ |
| $\$ 45,001-\$ 120,000$ | $\$ 5,092$ plus 32.5c for each \$1 over \$45,000 |
| $\$ 120,001-\$ 180,000$ | $\$ 29,467$ plus 37c for each \$1 over \$120,000 |
| $\$ 180,001$ and over | $\$ 51,667$ plus 45c for each \$1 over \$180,000 |
